### Steps to follow

Step 1: Using your chapter 1 notes, read all the pages pertaining to Aboriginals.

Step 2: On an 8 ½” x 11” paper, neatly draw a map of North America containing the following items:

- ♦ Asia and Siberia;
- ♦ North America;
- ♦ the Cordilleran ice sheet;
- ♦ the Laurentide ice sheet;
- ♦ a path clearly showing the migration of the First Nations from Northeast Asia to Siberia<sup>1</sup> to North America;
- ♦ a path clearly showing the migration of the Inuit from Siberia<sup>1</sup> to North America;
- ♦ the migration date(s) of the First Nations;
- ♦ the migration date(s) of the Inuit; and
- ♦ any written text you feel will explain why and how the First Nations and Inuit migrated to North America.

Step 3: Be sure to use color, symbols and a legend.

Step 4: Be creative, neat and take pride in your work!
