

Assignment #0.1: Physiographic Regions, Great Lakes, and Natural Resources History of Quebec and Canada 324



Instructions

Follow the steps below to prepare a detailed map outlining Canada's physiographic regions, Great Lakes, and its natural resources.

Steps to follow

Step 1: Using the unit 0 notes given to you, read all the pages pertaining to the physiographic regions of Canada, Great Lakes, as well as Canada's natural resources.

Step 2: On a plain 8 ½" x 11" paper, neatly draw a map of Canada and the northern part of the United States containing the following items:

- ♦ Canada's seven physiographic regions (Arctic lands, Cordillera, Interior plains, Canadian shield, Hudson Bay lowlands, St-Lawrence lowlands, Appalachian region);
- ♦ Canada's five Great Lakes (Lake Superior, Lake Michigan, Lake Huron, Lake Erie, Lake Ontario);
- ♦ Canada's natural resources (water, mineral mining, oil, natural gas, hydroelectric facilities, and other resources you have researched);
- ♦ a title for your map;
- ♦ written text that explains what a physiographic region is; and
- ♦ written text that explains many of Canada's natural resources.

Step 3: Be sure to include a legend.

Step 4: Neatly colour all of your map (don't leave any white space).

Step 5: Glue your map onto a piece of coloured construction paper that is slightly larger than your map. This will give your map a colourful border (frame).

Step 6: Write your full name and class group number on the front.

Step 7: Be creative, neat and take pride in your work!
